

aturday, August 16th was a day for exotic vehicles from New England to assemble in Merrimack, NH. The day started with perfect weather and concluded with a summer afternoon cloud burst to announce the end of the show.

The local Dodge Viper Club once again hosted the event and provided a top-notch venue. The occasion went

smoothly and was extremely well organized. This was the fifth year car fanatics attended the show to benefit the Make-A-Wish Foundation. A thank you also goes out to the Anheuser Busch folks for providing the beautiful grounds of the Merrimack Brewery as a backdrop for this annual automotive showcase.

The threatening weather forecast did not deter the hearty BMW loyalist. Thirty-five blue and white hood Roundels gleamed in the morning sunshine. [Does the Isetta's front door constitute a hood? -ed.] This number was a marked increase from twenty-one cars on the lawn in 2007. The goal of the White Mountain Chapter was to reach out to a wide variety of models and production years. We were not disappointed.

Long time club members Manny and Judy Brochu of Concord displayed two classic BMWs. Their 1981 320i and 1957 Isseta turned out to be two of the oldest cars in the paddock. The "rolling egg" was voted best in class against some tough competition. New comers included Corey Aiken presenting a 1986 735i sedan being shown for the first time. I salute anyone who steals a vintage car from the crusher and puts it back on the road as Corey has done with his 7. Tulley BMW of Nashua and Ultimate Motorwerks both provided examples of high performance BMWs. The dealership provided three new examples of the X5, 650i, and M3. Other M3s and Z cars filled every corner of the parking area. Some flashed the prestigious DINAN logo. Overall, a good cross section appeared with the entry of such cars as a 1972 2002 tii and a 2006 M6. Ben Burner's 740i traveled from Killingworth, Connecticut to make an appearance. The last car parked was a beautiful Z8 which arrived stylishly late like an automotive debutante entering a ballroom.

Additional groups included Ferrari, Lamborghini, Nissan, Lotus, Delorian, and many more. Some independent entries included a Ural motorcycle with sidecar (think of a BMW prewar R series built by a contemporary Russian manufacturing plant), a new Maserati Grandturismo, and a Panoz Roadster. Many photos of the show are posted on the chapter website.

The WMC would like to thank all who joined us as entrants or spectators in support of the Make-A-Wish Foundation by attending this celebration of cars, Clydesdales, and brewery tours. BMW entry fees alone provided over \$700 for the cause. More than \$10K was raised overall. Please look for this event on the 2009 August club calendar next year and plan to attend.

- November 5, 2008 Online voting will open. e.mail to membership announcing
 posting on website of all candidates and their statements.
- · November 30, 2008 Online voting closes.
- December 3, 2008 Board of Director's meeting. Members who did not vote
 online will have an opportunity to vote in person. At the end of the meeting the
 votes will be tallied and the results announced.



Back Roads Rally 2008 Saturday, October 18th

he 2007 "annual" Back Roads Rally was enjoyed so much we've brought it back for 2008. This year the "New England Seacoast Rally" will again be a unique photo rally but with fresh photos and updated route. Rain or shine, the rally will start on the waterfront in Newburyport, Mass. on Saturday, October 18th, and will hug the coastline up to the Portland Head Lighthouse in Maine. At just under 110 miles, it's a pleasant day's drive. With stops for lunch and sightseeing, most people will

finish the route in under six hours.

For those who may not know, the WMC Back Roads Rallies are not races; there are no check points or clocks to contest with and certainly no experience necessary! The format's simple and fun, and the route instructions easy to follow. The challenge is to put a set of photos in order so they match the things you see along the way. Then, you put the numbers on your answer sheet, and the scoring awards seeing everything and getting the order of things correct.


On-site registration will be open from 9-10 a.m. at the Newburyport Visitor's Center parking lot in the back at the pier near the Black Cow restaurant. The registration fee will be \$25/car payable by cash or check written out to "White Mountain Chapter, BMW CCA". This covers the

cost of the event, but does not include lunch or dinner. At least one person in each car must be a BMW CCA member, so please bring your BMW CCA I.D. or a Roundel address label. Non-members can join the club at registration (\$40 additional) and enjoy all the club benefits for a full year.

As in previous rallies, there will be two classes: Competition (two person team) and Touring (unlimited number of passengers). Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finishing teams in both classes. The awards ceremony will be held about 4 p.m. and afterwards, you can join other rally teams at a "buy your own" dinner at Two-Lights Lobster Shack at Cape Elizabeth or DeMillos floating restaurant in Portland, depending on the number of participants. Directions to the restaurants from the rally end point will be included in the rally package.



There's no advanced registration for this event. However, to assure we have enough rally packages for everyone, we need a car count. 
