

Sudden AccelerationIt's Actually A Good Thing

In 2010 the media latched Lonto the term "Sudden Acceleration". There were weekly stories of Toyotas flying down the highway without the drivers having any control over their runaway vehicles. At first I was confused since technically the term should have been "Unintended Acceleration". Sudden acceleration is actually a good thing. I have spent over thirty years and many thousands of dollars trying to enhance sudden

acceleration in my vehicles. Decreasing the 0 to 60mph time, increasing tire grip, or being able to quick shift into a higher gear has long been the goal of manufactures and owners. We have always been looking for new ways to get down the road or track in minimal time.

In my quest for sudden acceleration I have tried numerous performance modifications. They included everything from high flow air filters to

chips which reprogram the electronic control unit and a truckload of additional aftermarket performance parts. In my Air Force

days I heard stories and folklore of attempts to even use rocket motors or aviation fuel to literally launch a vehicle. Both of these practices could be fatal but make for great Myth Buster episodes.

Ironically, while gearheads tweak and twist the designs of BMWs to make them more responsive to driver inputs, the engineers in Germany incorporated deliberate delays in accelerator response. This is commonly known as throttle lag. Most cars now have Electronic Throttle Control (also known as "drive by wire") which produces the delay between the driver's input and the reaction of the car. Older BMWs like my 1994 525i have an actual



cable which is physically connected to the throttle body. Mashing down on the peddle opens the throttle and away you go. Newer cars with ECU technology have a sensor to measure how much you depress the pedal. The

sensor relays the movement

of the peddle and transmits a signal to the ECU. The ECU controls engine speed and causes a lag in acceleration.

Enter the need for the Sprint Booster. This is an easy to install

power converter I purchased from Bavarian Auto. It simply plugs into the back of the accelerator pedal assembly and hijacks the original signal from the sensor built into the pedal assembly. A small remote control is hardwired to the booster and can be positioned anywhere within two or three feet of the pedal; I tucked my control into the ash tray where it is out of

sight. The control is a single LED button allowing for three modes of operation. With the light off, the booster is off and the vehicle is in the stock setting. Press the button once for green and you are in level 1 for smooth boost. Press again for red and you are now in level 2 for aggressive boost. This is the favorite of everyone who has driven Rachelle's X3 outfitted

with the Sprint Booster. We only go back to the stock setting when we drop the car off to be serviced. We would hate to have a mechanic unexpectedly fly into the service bay with max boost. Overall, this is the best and easi-

I have installed into our newest BMW. It only involved one screwdriver and an Allen wrench. I did not even get dirt under my fingernails.

est modification



The X-Files - BMW Style I Want to Believe Have One

in BMW production model nomenclature means all-wheel-drive. My first introduction to Bavarian style all-wheel-drive came in the form of a 1990 325ix. What a great little car. I found it on a used car lot by accident and took it home that same day.

As much as I liked the all-wheel-drive option in a BMW car, I was very reluctant to see why BMW was planning to make SUVs back in the mid 1990s. After all, BMW owned Land Rover. The Brits were there to fill the need for the Queen, or Sporty Spice to drive a luxury SUV

been produced over the last dozen years. The Motorsport Tech division even offered handmade examples and the folks at Dinan tweaked insane power out of the larger engines. At the next car show ask chapter member Jan Mark Holtzer to let you look under the hood of his Dinan X5; gearheads will drool at the sight.

In the wake of the achievements of the X5 came the X3. In 2003 the X3 was first produced in Austria and was soon embedded firmly in the USA market. My first impressions were that it was a bit too cute for a BMW. It wasn't until my better half decided to take a test drive that I started looking

to a polo match. The "Sport Activity Vehicle" title, in an attempt to keep it separated from other manufacturers, only *mildly* disguised the BMW X5 project. At the time there seemed to already be armies of ungainly Super

Ugly Vehicles blundering along the American highways. Ford Explorers were doing well just to keep upright and on the pavement. So why pull down the reputation of fine Bavarian engineering with a line of family trucksters? Despite the reservations of many driving enthusiasts and long time club members, the BMW X5 SAV (a truck per DOT designation) was put into production.

To be accurate, the X5 was not the first all wheel drive "truck" to come from BMW when it was launched in 1998. From 1937 to 1940, BMW built (along with two other manufacturers) the type 20B/325 which was both four wheel drive and four wheel steering. The two ton jeep-like people mover was hard to spot

as a BMW since it swastikas sported on the hood instead of roundels. Badges were omitted to provide secrecy regarding the point of manufacturer in wartime. The 325 was not a success for numerous reasons and Bavarian all-wheel-drive disappeared along with the Third Reich. Fast forward half a centu-

ry and BMW did score a financial home run with the X5 and still produces the all purpose vehicle to this day. The Germans gave the driving public what they wanted. One example of the SAV even landed in my immediate family's driveway. The in-laws brought home a new first generation 3.0 liter version from the BMW dealership in Natick. I was actually surprised how well it drove and took to the road. Many versions of the model have

seriously at the well appointed and capable SAV. The X3 truly drives like a much smaller vehicle and is quite nimble compared to anything else with enough ground clearance for NH potholes. That is not to say I would ever

expect to see one drifting though the curves at the Loudon speedway. However with performance tires and wheels Rachelle's baby *could* handle it. With the X3, BMW had another marketing and sales victory and truly had "X fever". Soon another X was on the way.

In 2007 the X6 appeared in the showrooms as the

newest tall rolling X drive offering. The X6 souped up edition materialized shortly afterward as an M version. Now drivers can choose a quad-drive SAV in three sizes. While the X5 and X3 are solidly in the BMW lineup they have both been refreshed in body and engines. Tulley BMW and BMW of Stratham proudly presented the all new X3 in Dec 2010. I was surprised to see the large number of customers who attended the unveiling. Some


had already pre-purchased the new vehicle without ever viewing it in person. That shows the desire and faith the public seems to now have in the product BMW is giving them. There is also reason to believe the rumors that X1 and X7 projects are in the works. So if you never

thought the abbreviations BMW and SUV could be used well together, give one of the Xs a chance. They provide Bavarian performance in a versatile package.






