

Synaptic 3 Performance Where There's No Such Thing As Just Good Enough

Irecently had the opportunity to tour *Synaptic 3 Performance*, a facility located in of all places, Candia, New Hampshire. They're tucked away in the back of a large industrial building. Once inside it became clear this is no ordinary garage. You look up to the left as you come in the door and see six track maps modeled on the walls high above the shop floor. Towards the back are carved word plaques with terms like, "Track Out", "Apex", "Turn In" & "Horsepower", that trace the upper mezzanine where the parts display and waiting area overlook the shop.

The place is packed with equipment, but well organized. There is a complete section for machine work and metal fabrication. Based on the cars inside I'd say that is their "bread and butter". They make all kinds of things from scratch, as well as install products from a wide variety of manufacturers.

In talking with Dana and Ron, the owners of Synaptic 3, they had this to say, "We push hard to stand above the rest in terms of quality and execution. Our current customers will tell you, we sweat the details more than any of our competitors. Our standard practices have been developed and refined through years of practical experience." Ron went on to say, "We don't follow industry standards because frankly they're typically not stringent or exacting

enough. We're perfectionists and in our philosophy there is no such thing as just good enough."

They also stressed the relationship they have with their clients. Dana mentioned, "Our first question for you will always be, 'What do you plan to do with the car?' "They make it a point to sit down with every new customer and understand their goals and make recommendations based on those discussions to fit their intended application.

They have the equipment to set up your car properly, having built and tuned track tested road course cars as well as championship rally cars. One of those rally cars was sitting in the lot -quite impressive.

You'll know you're in the right place when you visit their shop. They have a drive-on alignment rack utilizing the Beissbarth Microline 4000 Alignment System, the same system I'm told is used in BMW dealerships. They also have Longacre scales to corner balance your car. Lastly, and impossible to miss, they have a Mustang AWD500SE dynamometer housed in its own

separate air managed building for tuning and testing two-wheel drive and all-wheel drive vehicles.

I asked about BMW aftermarket parts and they rattled off that they're direct partners with Supersprint, Eisenmann, Evosport, DBA, and Cobb Tuning just to name a few. Dana expounded, "As matter of fact, we've actually been factory trained for Schroth Harness installations by Carl Schroth himself, and something we found pretty ironic is that he's actually a die hard motorcycle enthusiast."



As you can see *Synaptic 3 Performance* is pretty committed to doing the best job possible. If you have some modifications planned, need a tech inspection, or have an interesting project in mind, you owe it to yourself to check out the guys over at *Synaptic 3 Performance*.

Your Humble BMW Tow FittingA Simple, Easy to Use, Money Saving Tool



BMW is known for providing owners with numerous accessories. Most are found under the hood or within reach of the driver, -but not all. Some very important ones are tucked away out of sight. This is the case for the onboard tool kit. It is only for occasional use and rarely sees the light of day but you should be familiar with its location and use.

needs to be pulled out of a ditch or loaded onto a retrieval vehicle (a.k.a. tow truck). It's the only approved way to tow or winch your BMW.

Once upon a time BMWs had bright shiny chromed steel bumpers. These easily made great attachment points for pulling a disabled car. Alas, the

Every BMW comes with some basic tools in its kit, which is usually in the trunk or hatch to be used for performing a few emergency procedures. Over the years, the tool kit has decreased in size as the cars became more

and more complex. Spare spark plugs and the associated removal tools have long since been deleted. Most drivers were reluctant to change spark plugs in the garage, so who was going to swap out fouled plugs along the roadside? Anyway, unless you're an antique BMW owner, those days, for better or worse, have passed.

So what is in currently in the tool kit?

Just a handful of the most basic items among which you'll find the humble tow fitting. As uninteresting as it may look, this is probably the most important piece of the kit. Even if you have 100% warranty and roadside coverage, you really should know how to use this little device. To mitigate damage to your BMW's body or frame, it'll be used when your vehicle

bumpers today are now hidden by bodywork in the name of both styling and aerodynamics. With the steel bumpers no longer accessible, the tow fitting is the correct means to connect with a solid component of the car.

The quickest way for a tow truck
driver to attach his winch cable
to a car is with a large hook
more suited for pulling a tuna boat

than moving your prized BMW.

The tow fitting is a five inch metal loop that screws into a receptacle behind a small rectangular cover panel easily found in both the front and rear bumper covers. These covers can be popped out with your fingernail or the screwdriver which is also provided in the tool kit. Once the receptacle is exposed, the fitting is then screwed in by hand, all the way, to create a solid attachment for the pull.

Attaching a tow strap or cable to any structure other than a properly fitted tow fitting will result in certain damage to the vehicle. A truck driver trying to save time may grapple on to anything under the car to winch it forward, and the quickest way to attach his winch cable is with a large hook more suited for pulling a tuna boat than moving your prized BMW. A mechanic told me he has seen more than a few cars with bent steering components dropped off at his shop after this haphazard treatment.

Do not let this happen to your baby. Be adamant about the use of the tow fitting and always insist on a flat bed truck if you have an xDrive or if your owners manual recommends one for towing. Expansive/expensive damage will occur if these requirements are not adhered to.

So now you know what a tow fitting is. Make sure you have one in your car and know were it is before you actually need it some dark night when you are stuck in snow bank. You will prevent a bad situation from turning into something much worse.

I made a gentleman's agreement to buy this car and I am sticking to it. We do the paperwork, stay another night while the issues are taken care of, and hit the open road for home.

BMW CCA National Election 2013 Two Candidates Vying for North Atlantic Regional VP Position

National Election Regional Ballots were included with the January Roundel inside the plastic wrap along with a special address label sticker. To vote, that label needs to be affixed to the post card ballot to verify your voting status. Voting commenced on January 2nd and closes Thursday, February 28th, 2013. Your ballot must be received at the National Office by noon EST. There is no electronic voting for this election

and your ballot will be valid only if you were a BMW CCA member in good standing as of December 15, 2012.

There are two candidates contesting the seat for North Atlantic Regional VP, Scott Stowell, and incumbant John Sullivan. Following are candidacy statements from both.

John Sullivan Candidacy Statement

As a 26-year BMW CCA member, I have held Board positions as President, Vice President and Director of Activities for the Boston Chapter, been the National Membership Coordinator for seven years, and for the past seven years have served as your North Atlantic Region VP. As a retired manager, from a National Communications Company, now without the demands of a career and time constraints companies place on their employees, I have brought my dedication and enthusiasm to the NA RVP position. The amount of paperwork, dedication and travel commitments involved with the position keeps one very busy.

There is no requirement, in the RVP Job Description in the BMW CCA Operations Manual, that requires an RVP to visit all their Chapters. In a perfect world, that may be ideal and I would enjoy doing that, but the reality is that I have a limited travel budget. I attend all the NA Regional Chapter Events in order to reach a larger audience of members.

I wanted to review with you some of the behind the scenes work that I have done this past year in 2012 that many people are not aware of so one can gain a better perspective about what an RVP's work commitments are:

Attended four BMW CCA National Board Meetings:

Each meeting requires a Pre-Meeting Report from the RVP, a three day weekend time commitment and travel required to various locations around the US.

Participated in 10 BMW CCA BOD Conference Calls:

These multi-hour Conference Calls require one to be prepared and informed about the various subjects or issues that are being discussed.

• Attended the following National Events, Regional & Local Chapter Events:

BMW CCA National Chapter Congress in Dallas, TX February 24-26; NJ Chapter Show & Shine June 8; Patroon Chapter Vintage at Saratoga, NY July 13-15; Allegheny Chapter Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix Festival July 20-23 in Pittsburgh, PA; Boston Chapter Concours August 12; Boston Chapter RI Show & Shine Narragansett, RI; and annually attend NY Chapters Car Show on Long Island NY but was unable to do so this year due to a schedule conflict with O'Fest. BMW CCA O'Fest in Columbus, OH September 17-23; Green Mountain Chapter OktoberFAST Show & Shine October 5-6 Grafton, VT; Recruiting for BMW CCA at Bavarian Autosport Car Show in Portsmouth, NH October 7; and the NA Region Driving Events Committee Meeting in Albany NY November 30- December 1.

 Published four NA Regional Newsletters, in multi page format, to all Chapter Officers to communicate what is happening at the National Club level:

 Hosted & Arranged for Speakers for three NA Region Conference Calls and sent the call minutes out to each Chapter Officer:




